



- 2. This school was established initially as Nursery School during 1970-71 in the temporary building (T – 55) to cater to the educational needs of tiny tots of the station. Subsequently it was shifted to Cadets Mess building and T/55 was made available for Kendriya Vidyalaya (Primary Branch) of K.V. Hebbal and was named as Air Force Elementary School, Yelahanka and established classes upto Std VII. Simultaneously KV (Priamry Branch of K.V. Hebbal) was upgraded as independent Kendriya Vidyalaya and shifted to Cadets Mess Complex.. Class VII was introduced at Air Force School in 1988. Construction of its permanent building started on 19 Feb 89 and was completed on 29 May 90. The school started functioning in its permanent building from the academic session 1900 – 91, Class IX was introduced in the academic session 1993 – 94. Due to the overwhelming demand from needful parents, the school attained the status of secondary school from the academic session 1994-95. Although the school was established primarily for the benefit of children of Air Force personnel at Yelahanka, it has on its roll not only the children of other defence personnel but also of local civilians.

The school has a total strength of 1131 students guided sincerely by 45 Teachers and 05 Admin Staff and 18 Multi-Tasking Staff.

- 3. The quality of teaching is kept high by the appropriate teacher-student ratio and teachers with high academic integrity.
- 4. The medium of instruction is English. The objective of the school is to enable students to achieve proficiency in both English & Hindi.

- 5. In classes LKG VIII text books and syllabus are followed as per AIR HQ directives. CBSE syllabus and NCERT text books are followed in class IX & X.
- 6. Computer classes are conducted from LKG onwards.
- 7. Sanskrit is taught from class VI VIII as third language and as second language in IX & X.
- 8. Air Force School, Yelahanka prepares students for the "All India Secondary School Certificate Examination" conducted by the CBSE, New Delhi.

- 5. Students should be habitually clean and always neatly dressed. The school uniform should be worn on all working days and for all school functions. Students who are slovenly dressed or not in uniform will be sent home after 3 advices/warnings.
- 6. All boys (except Sikhs) must keep their hair short. Girls must tie their hair neatly in two plaits.
- 7. No books (other than text books or library books), magazine or paper should be brought to the school.
- 8. Lending or borrowing of money or other articles is not allowed.
- Students are not allowed to use the school telephone without the permission of the receptionist. They will not be called to answer phone calls during class hours. The students should carry their permission card with them.
- 10. The school insists on a few measures to be observed by the members of staff and all students. Care must be taken to observe rules in order to maintain clean and green surroundings. School premises must not be littered with disposable tumblers, papers or polythene bags. Air Force School, Yelahanka is a polybag free zone.
- 11. Plucking / damaging flowers is not permitted.
- 12. Students are expected to respect the property of others. This includes respect for school property. No student should damage any school furniture, write or draw anything on the walls or in any way damage things belongings to others. Any school property damaged even by accident should be reported at once to the class teacher or the co-ordinator or the Principal.
- 13. Every student must carry his almanac and identity card to school each day.

- 14. Students are not allowed to bring any sharp instruments like knives or any kind of object that can cause injury to others.
- 15. Student are advised to keep their classroom, school building and campus as clean as possible, and throw trash into the dustbins.
- 16. The school is not responsible for goods lost. It is not advisable to bring valuable articles (like expensive watches, fountain pens, ipods, toys, mobile phones etc.) to school. In case of violation of this rule, the articles will be confiscated.
- 17. No student is permitted to bring a mobile phone, ipods ,cds,vcd,to the school.
- 18. Destructive activities will be subject to punishment.
- 19. Students will not instigate other co-students or juniors to indulge in any misbehaviour or any form of anti-social activity which will bring disrepute to the school and could spoil the career of the concerned student.
- 20. Students using unfair means during examinations will face disciplinary action as decided by the school authorities.
- 21. Nail polish and other cosmetics are not allowed.
- 22. Girl students to tie hair in two plaits with ribbons. (Blue / White as per Uniform)
- Noise, using crackers or splashing colours during any time in the school premises
 is strictly forbidden. Non-Compliance of this instruction will result in expulsion from
 the school.
- 24. Any damage done will be made good by the students/class concerned in the form of fine imposed for such an offence. Such acts should be brought to the notice of Teachers / Principal.
- 25. There should be no whistling on standing in and around the class room and or in the school campus. Running along the veranda or leaving classes is strictly prohibited. After a second warning, the students are liable for disciplinary action.
- 26. On birthdays students are expected to bring a sapling in a drive to instill eco friendly habits. Chocolates and other eateries are discouraged. Parents to cooperate in this object.
- 27. The name of a student may be struck off from the school rolls if all dues and fees is not paid within 30 days after the last date of payment. Re-admission charge to be paid.

 - c. Writing question or answer on any material other than the answer book given by the invigilator.

The Principal and School Management will use their discretion to detain or expel student for unfair practice during examinations.

WITHDRAWAL

- 1. If a child has to be withdrawn from school, parents are requested to give 3 working days notice in writing.
